


# Link Building: Search Operators Cheat Sheet

Basic Operators		Overview	General Examples

allintext:	results containing all text matching term		
allintitle:	results containing title text matching term		
allinurl:	results containing URL matching term		
author:	newsgroup articles by specified author		
cache:	cached version of a webpage		
define:	definition of matching term		
filetype:	results matching filetype term		
group:	articles from specific groups/subareas		
inanchor:	results with anchor text links pointing to page matching term		
info:	information about corresponding page		
intext:	results containing text matching term		
intitle:	results containing term in title		
inurl:	results containing term in URL		
link:	pages that point to specified URL		
location:	articles from a specified location		
phonebook:	all public telephone listings for a person		
related:	pages similar to specified page		
site:	pages from specified site		
Note	There should be no space between the operator and your search term. Eg. inurl:directory

intitle:directory + keyword(s)			
inurl:directory + keyword(s) -nofollow			
keyword(s) intitle:"submit * url"
